



"If I can buy it, it must be safe"

- More than half of parents mistakenly believe that all sellers on online platforms are checking the safety of their products.
- Almost three-quarters of parents mistakenly believe that any product aimed at children under 5 has to be fully tested and certified safe by an independent body before it can be sold online.

- First-ever UK study on magnets
- Over 300 hospital cases

"One in 10 of these young patients had surgery with most ending up with serious problems, like needing part of their bowel removed or requiring a stoma."

- Super strong magnets can be 17 times stronger than UK safety limits
- We've found magnets with a flux of 850 when the limit is 50
- Online marketplaces aren't yet required to vet the safety of the products sold on their platforms





- Only buy magnets from reputable retailers or brand names you know
- Beware if buying magnets from overseas sellers on online marketplaces – there's no way of knowing if they're safe
- Avoid small, loose magnets if you have small children
- Teach older children to never put magnets in their mouths
- If you think your child may have swallowed magnets, go straight to A&E or call an ambulance
